



During TVA's construction of Cherokee Dam, the floodplain created would ultimately cover the land occupied by Morristown's Steam Power Plant. Discussions began between The Commission and TVA to resolve the issue with the Commission creating an Advisory Group consisting of a broad spectrum of citizens from within the city limits. Negotiations lasted over a year with the end results being the Commission's first Power Contract with TVA, signed on June 3, 1941.

With the signing of the Power Contract, TVA purchased the Commission's Steam Power Plant and land for \$368,500 and relocated the Commission's Water Intake which had also been lost to the floodplain. Throughout the relationship, TVA has delivered power to Morristown at various substation locations. The current primary location being a multi tenant facility located in the Cedar Creek area which serves Hamblen, Grainger and Hawkins counties. A second location on SR160 provides a diverse/redundant delivery site.

As part of its growing portfolio of medical device and healthcare solutions, TEAM Technologies will produce point-of-care (POC) tests to assist organizations seeking the benefits of rapid testing for COVID-19. TEAM Technologies is producing the *in-vitro* diagnostic (IVD) test with Maxim Biomedical, who developed the test as part of the NIH Rapid Acceleration of Diagnostics RADx<sup>SM</sup> initiative, a program launched last April to speed innovation in the development, commercialization, and implementation of testing technologies for COVID-19.

TEAM Technologies has facilities across the United States providing a variety of services ranging from product development, supply line expertise, and packaging and kitting of the SARS-CoV-2 diagnostic tests. "We are pleased to be working with the team at Maxim Biomedical as an instrumental partner in bringing this much needed testing solution to market," commented Marshall White, President and CEO of TEAM Technologies. Collectively, TEAM and Maxim currently have a goal to produce 3 million tests by year's end and to achieve a production rate of 15 million tests per month in early 2021.

The SARS-CoV-2 Rapid Antigen Diagnostic Test utilizes Lateral Flow Assay (LFA) technology with a streamlined workflow and a closed-tube format that eliminates the need for expensive equipment or a reader to perform. The assay achieves this by combining the specimen swab, reagents, and test strip in a compact, self-contained environment, allowing for incubation, reading and disposal in one tube. Results are available within 15 minutes and stable for more than two hours.

Complementing the IVD and POC experience of Maxim Biomedical, TEAM Technologies is employing its medical device manufacturing capabilities to rapidly scale production quantities of the SARS-CoV-2 rapid antigen test. "Many organizations, from schools to businesses to factories, can benefit from having the ability to perform testing that produces safe, quick and easy-to-interpret results," White added. "We are proud to partner with our colleagues at Maxim Biomedical to make this test available."





## Mask Mandate Update for Small Businesses



#### ATTITUDES ABOUT BUSINESSES + MASK MANDATE



- Most comments related to businesses and the mask mandate support businesses' right to enforce restrictions as they see fit. Some commenters claim they would not feel safe entering a business where the mandate is not enforced or complied with. (268 interactions)
- Only a single comment was captured that expressed a willingness to boycott establishments that enforce mask-wearing. Specifically, this comment conveyed a desire to resume shopping in Hamblen County only when the mandate is lifted (25 interactions).

Additionally, such claims were not present on posts by various businesses stating their mask requirements, including the College Square Mall and Rose Center.

## **September is National Recovery Month**



The theme for 2020 National Recovery Month is *Join the Voices for Recovery: Celebrating Connections.* ReVIDA Recovery Centers would like to thank our partners in Morristown and the surrounding area for their support since our opening in 2018. Together, we are reclaiming lives and making positive changes in our community.

The novel coronavirus pandemic has upended life as we know it in East Tennessee, taking a toll on our mental and physical health. Those who struggle with opioid use disorder feel those struggles even more acutely. That's why it has never been more important to recognize the annual <u>National Recovery Month</u> this September. This initiative, created by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services (SAMHSA) and continued by <u>Faces and Voices of Recovery</u> is an annual <u>observance</u> held "to educate Americans that substance use treatment and mental health services can enable those with a mental and/or substance use disorder to live a healthy and rewarding life." Typically, organizations across East Tennessee and Southwest Virginia host events and raise awareness for those living with a substance use disorder and provide solu-

tions. This year, like most things, those events will likely be found online. For those in recovery, each new day is a victory. We must continue to celebrate Recovery Month, in whatever format we can, to celebrate those who are working to reclaim their life from opioid use disorder, as well as recognize the important work local organizations are doing to help people find a path to recovery, reduce neonatal abstinence syndrome, and increase the availability of naloxone and other interventions to prevent people from dying after an opioid overdose. While we may be facing a global pandemic, one thing remains clear: the opioid epidemic is not going away anytime
